

Population of Gangetic dolphins on the rise in UP

The efforts of the double-engine government and the Namami Gange Mission towards cleaning the river Ganga and maintaining its uninterrupted flow have led to significant increase in the population of Gangetic dolphins in the recent times. Experts have even described the increase in Gangetic dolphin's population as a "positive environmental indicator". According to the Indian Wildlife Institute, there are currently about 4,000 dolphins

in the Ganga and its tributaries. It indicates that the Ganga provides a favourable habitat for dolphins and that the river's water is also clean. The number of dolphins is expected to increase even further in the future. According to estimates, the number of Gangetic dolphins in Uttar Pradesh is expected to reach 2,000, more than half of the total Gangetic dolphins found in India. Therefore, the primary responsibility for their conservation and development also falls on UP. In this regard, Uttar Pradesh

has implemented a new tourism policy for the state and declared a Dolphin Sanctuary area in the Chambal Sanctuary. Currently, approximately 111 dolphins have been recorded in the Chambal region. After Prime Minister Modi announced Project Dolphin, public interest in this unique and rare mammal has increased. However, a significant portion of the population remains unfamiliar with this charismatic megafauna. Therefore, conserving the Gangetic dolphins will not only raise awareness about

protecting this species but also enhance efforts to maintain the purity and uninterrupted flow of the Ganga. Awareness and public participation are the main aspects of the Namami Gange Mission. Based on this, the goal is set to stabilise the population of Gangetic dolphins by 2030 and double the number of more endangered species. In this, the Clean Ganga Mission has succeeded in fostering better coordination among state governments, experts, non-governmental organisations and local peo-

ple. Through pollution reduction measures, conservation of wetlands, and efforts to improve river flow under the Namami Gange project, suitable habitat has been provided for Gangetic dolphins. The river dolphin is an extremely special megafauna of the Indian subcontinent, classified as critically endangered globally. Efforts are underway to conserve it in India. They are found primarily in the Ganga and its tributaries, including the Ramganga, Yamuna, Gomti, Ghaghara, Rapti, Son, Gandak, Chambal and Koshi.

History-sheeter held after encounter with police

A joint team of the Special Operation Group and Chinhat police arrested a history-sheeter and dreaded criminal after an encounter with him early in the morning in the area on Wednesday. DCP (East) Prabal Pratap Singh said the joint team was tipped-off about the miscreants involved in the indiscriminate firing at a luxury car in the night on May 19 at Chinhat overbridge to create terror and extort money from the occupants of the car. "We were tipped-off that the miscreants involved in the firing were roaming in a car which did not have a registration number. The grey colour car was later located in the area and the cops asked the occupants to stop the car for checking. However, the occupants in the car opened fire at the police team and attempted to flee. They were challenged and the police team fired on the miscreants after they did not surrender. In the exchange of firing, prime accused Nitin Kundi suffered bullet injuries on his leg and was nabbed," the DCP said. He said Nitin Kundi was a his-

tory-sheeter of Chinhat and was involved in terrorising people and extorting money from them. "His aide managed to escape," he said. The officer disclosed that Nitin, who has been admitted to a hospital, has formed a gang of youths of tender age. He is a drug peddler and involved in extortion and is a drug addict, he added. BSP facing biggest threat from own 'deserters'

Having won four Lok Sabha seats in the last parliamentary elections out of the constituencies going to polls in the sixth phase in Uttar Pradesh on May 25, Bahujan Samaj Party is facing the biggest threat from its own sitting MPs who deserted the party to contest the election from other political outfits. Those whom BSP once trusted the most and fielded them ignoring the demands of party cadre, today they are challenging the BSP by becoming strangers to the party. In this sixth phase of Lok Sabha elections, in the three constituencies which BSP had won last

time, its rebel MPs are now challenging it by going to the rival camp. Now it remains to be seen how much success these BSP rebels get from other parties and how the BSP army is able to defeat them. Last time, the BSP had won the Ambedkar Nagar, Shrivasthi, Lalganj and Jaunpur Lok Sabha seats amongst the 13 constituencies which will go to polls in this phase. Except Jaunpur, the MPs representing the other three constituencies have joined other parties. Ambedkar Nagar MP Ritesh Pandey is contesting the election on BJP ticket. Shrivasthi MP Ram Shiromani has joined the Samajwadi Party and is contesting as its candidate. Lalganj MP Sangeeta Azad has

joined BJP, but the ruling party has given ticket to Neelam Sonkar from there. Actually, Jaunpur MP Shyam Singh Yadav was also looking to contesting the election on the ticket of some other party, particularly Congress, but after formation of INDIA Bloc and SP and Congress joining hands, he was left with no other option but to wait for Mayawati's nod to again contest on BSP ticket to retain his seat. Interestingly, the BSP had given its ticket to gangster-turned-politician Dhananjay Singh's wife Shrikala Singh from Jaunpur, but just a day before the last day of nomination, her ticket was withdrawn and sitting MP Shyam Singh Yadav was asked to file his nomina-

tion from Jaunpur. Now Dhananjay and his wife are supporting BJP candidate Kripa Shankar Singh. It is to be seen what support these sitting BSP MPs will get after they shifted their loyalties to contest the elections on tickets of other parties or support them. Talking in terms of caste equation, Dalit voters in Ambedkar Nagar are said to be around 28 per cent. Muslims are around 15 per cent and Brahmins are around 14 per cent. The BSP has placed its bet on Muslim candidate Qamar Hayat Ansari on the basis of Muslim and Dalit equation. In Shrivasthi, Muslims are said to be around 28 per cent and Dalits around 17 per cent. The BSP had won

the last election on this equation when it was in alliance with SP. This time the BSP has placed its bet on Muslim candidate Moinuddin Ahmed from Shrivasthi. Lalganj is a safe seat for BSP as 27 per cent voters are Dalits and 14 per cent are from Muslims. Due to it being a reserved seat, the BSP has fielded Dr Indu Chaudhary from Lalganj. Indu Chaudhary is assistant professor in the English department of Banaras Hindu University. Now it remains to be seen how successful the BSP's strategy will be and how many voters support it especially when its sitting MP Sangeeta Azad has left the party to join BJP and is supporting Neelam Sonkar.

SGPGIMS completes 200 bone marrow transplants

Dr Sanjeev, associate professor (Clinical/BMT) of the haematology department of Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow said here on Tuesday that recently they had completed 200 bone marrow transplants with a very good success rate which is comparable to the good transplant centres of India. He said that it was a big achievement for their BMT unit. He further informed that the BMT (Bone Marrow Transplant) programme was started way back in 1999 in SGPGIMS by Prof Soniya Nityanand. "It was the fourth centre in India to start the BMT programme. Old BMT unit had its own limitations and large numbers of transplants were not

possible, hence a new BMT unit was inaugurated by the Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in December, 2019. We started the BMT programme in the new unit in January, 2020 but after three transplants we were forced to stop the programme due to COVID-19 pandemic," he said. He said that after the second wave of COVID-19, in July 2021, they restarted the programme and since then 109 transplants (66 autologous and 43 allogeneic) had been done, (total 209 transplants, since the inception of the department). "Bone marrow transplantation is a team work. The BMT unit of SGPGIMS has got the award for the second consecutive year on International Nursing Day. We are doing autologous as well as allogeneic HSCITs for various benign and malignant haematological diseases.

Cyber thugs duping man of over Rs 30 lakh held

The cyber police on Wednesday arrested two miscreants who 'digitally' arrested a man and duped him of over Rs 30 lakh. Those arrested were identified as Rajiv Bhasin aka Raju and Mohit Chopra aka Nanu, both of Agra district. They had duped one Niranjan Singh while posing as custom officers and later as CBI officers and threatening him of legal consequences, saying a parcel was booked in his name in Cambodia and his passport had been used in the crime of sending parcels illegally. The accused also terrorised the victim, saying his name could figure in a case of money laundering and asked him to settle the issue or face the

addresses and called the victims on Skype or video call while showing the victims a police station-like set-up. They threatened victims that they had been 'digitally' arrested and then spelt out the deal. The money taken from victims was credited in the bank accounts of the mentors of the miscreants operating from foreign countries. The miscreants were given 1.8 per cent of the total deal. The police were stunned when they checked the bank account transaction details. A total of 39 transactions of Rs 1.68 crore were done - one from UP, six from Andhra Pradesh, two from Haryana, three from Rajasthan, two from Maharashtra, six from Telangana, two from Assam and one from Bihar.

Warm night conditions to prevail in city

There will be no respite from heat for the city denizens. While the morning temperatures are already high in the city, from Thursday onwards the nights are also going to get warmer. Senior scientist of the Met department, Mohammed Danish, said that the day temperature in Lucknow would be 40-42 degree Celsius and the night temperature would touch 30 degree Celsius, which would be above normal. "Easterly winds are not allowing the night temperature to drop in Lucknow," he said. He said that warm nights would prevail for the next three days. Elaborating on the scene prevailing in Uttar Pradesh, he said that in the western UP, heat wave conditions would prevail for the next five days. "In the eastern UP, the heat wave will not prevail for the first two days but from the third day the heat wave conditions will appear," he said. He further informed that in the western UP, warm wester-



ly winds were causing heat wave conditions. "In eastern UP, the warm westerlies are gaining strength and the easterlies are getting weak and hence heat wave conditions will start in after two days," he added. Meanwhile Lucknow Zoo Director Aditi Sharma said that to protect the wild animals from the heat, Nawab Wajid Ali Shah Zoological Park, Lucknow had taken several measures for different wild animals as per their needs. "In the enclosures of many wild animals, where there is more sunlight, a large number of trees and plants have been planted around them so that there is natural greenery there and the wild animals get relief from the heat. First of all, the provision of clean drinking water for wild animals has

been beefed up. Fresh drinking water is filled in the morning and evening in the enclosures for the wildlife to drink. The cages of wild animals are cleaned daily by washing them with water so that the enclosures remain cool and cleanliness is also maintained," she said. "More than 25 coolers have been installed in the enclosures of wild animals to protect them from heat," she said. She said that sprinklers had also been installed to keep the enclosures of wild animals cool and to protect the animals by spraying water.

Grain trader looted in Itaunja

Two unidentified miscreants riding a motorcycle looted cash from a grain trader in Itaunja police station on Wednesday. There were reports that the miscreants fired several rounds in the air while fleeing. DCP (North) Abhijeet R Shanker disclosed that the miscreants, wielding country-made pistols, forced the grain trader Arif of Itaunja to go inside the shop and looted the cash box containing the cash. He denied reports that the

miscreants opened several rounds of fire in the air. "We have formed teams consisting of the crime branch and the surveillance cell and hope to crack the case soon," the DCP said. According to the DCP, the miscreants reached Arif's shop at Ustrana crossing by a motorcycle. They entered the shop and held Arif hostage at gunpoint. They then looted the cash and sped off the scene. Arif is a wholesale dealer of wheat. The neighbouring shop owners said they could not guess

foul play as they mistook the miscreants as customers and wheat sellers. They said Arif raised an alarm after the miscreant sped off the scene and it was only then that they came to know of the loot. The traders have demanded immediate arrest of the miscreants. Sources in police said the teams were probing the rivalry angle also in the loot case. "It is possible that the miscreant had some old rivalry with Arif and they executed the crime to avenge it," they opined.

Teenager killed in road mishap

In a tragic incident, an 18-year-old boy was killed after an uncontrolled e-rickshaw hit him in Talkatora police station area in the night on Tuesday. As per reports, the victim, Gangasagar of E Block of Rajajipuram, was returning home after getting the tank of his motorcycle filled when an e-rickshaw hit his two-wheeler at D Block crossing around 10:30 pm. He was rushed to Rani Laxmi Bai Hospital where he died during treatment in the night. Police registered a case and started an investigation. The agitated local residents demanded curbs on plying of e-rickshaws in the area. "The e-rickshaws have become a menace for the people living in the area. Every now and then road mishaps are caused by e-rickshaws. Most of these e-rickshaws are being driven by minors or those who do not have a commercial driving licence. Besides, the e-rickshaws have no registration numbers and so it is practical-

ly difficult to identify the vehicle involved in an accident," the residents said. Meanwhile, the 13-year-old student Anwar Ali of Panchasara village in Gosainganj, who had suffered critical injuries in a road mishap, succumbed to the injuries at the Trauma Centre. His family filed a complaint on Wednesday. Anwar was returning home on May 15 when he was hit by a loader at Kaperia village. He was taken to CHC in Gosainganj where the doctors referred him to the Trauma Centre of KGMU in view of his serious condition. He, however, died on May 19. In another incident, a divyang spending his days at a tempo stand in Rajajipuram and eking out his living by begging alms was crushed to death in the area on Wednesday. The victim, identified as Pooran of Hardoi district, was staying at a corner of the tempo stand and begged alms to feed himself. On Wednesday, when he was

out begging alms near the tempo stand, a truck laden with LPG cylinders ran over him around 9:30 am. The driver escaped after the accident. The commuters rushed Pooran to Rani Laxmi Bai hospital where he was pronounced dead.

SUICIDE

A 12-year-old girl was found hanging at her home in Gosainganj on Wednesday. The girl, Mahi of Kanji Khara, along with her sibling Mahak, was at home and her parents had gone to the field to harvest crops. Around 8 am, Mahak called her father, Jitendra Kumar Rawat, and informed him that Mahi had committed suicide. Jitendra rushed home and broke open the doors in the presence of villagers and other members of his family. Mahi was found hanging from a bamboo pole with a saree tied around her neck. The police sent the body for autopsy and started the investigation.
