

'Criminals barriers to security, development' CM distributes appointment letters

The government's sympathies lie with the poor, destitute, deprived, Dalits and extremely backward classes and not with mafia and criminals as seen during previous regimes, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said on Monday.

Distributing appointment letters to 240 candidates selected for the posts of junior assistant and computer operator in the Minority and Technical Education departments at a ceremony held at Lok Bhavan auditorium in Lucknow, the chief minister described criminals as "barriers to security, good governance and development of society", and said that cracking down on them as well as building a corruption-free, safe and fair society where the underprivileged had access to government's schemes were the priorities of his government.

The chief minister also conveyed his best wishes to the 240 candidates who have been selected through Manav Sampada Portal under Mission Rozgar and emphasised his commitment to providing employment opportunities to the youths of Uttar Pradesh through a transparent and impartial process of Mission Rozgar.

"In the past six years, Uttar Pradesh has achieved new heights in line with the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Candidates hailing from 60 different districts have been selected, ensuring that opportunities are accessible to individuals across the entire state. The government is maintaining absolute transparency in the entire recruitment process. No minister or secretary knows where a person will be posted after selection," Yogi said.

He said that computer assistants had also played a big role in the transformation of UP.

"Perceptions of people have changed about Uttar Pradesh. Files are no longer kept pending...

Today the state has achieved the goals of security and ease of living and ease of doing business. We have brought the Centre's projects on the ground. Files are cleared within three days these days," he said.

UP no longer carries burden of negative stereotypes: Yogi

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday said that the double-engine government of Uttar Pradesh had won the trust of half of Uttar Pradesh's population on the issue of security. Addressing the 'UP Rising: 10 Saal 10 Changes' event at Hotel Taj, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said that Uttar Pradesh had experienced a significant reduction in crime, with not even a single riot occurring in the past six and a half years. "Today, the state enjoys a secure environment, reinforced by official figures from the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) confirming the decline in various crime categories," Chief Minister Yogi said.

He further highlighted that during the 2022 elections, his government's track record in maintaining law and order in the state played an important role in securing a resounding two-thirds majority.

"It is a big achievement which reflects the increased sense of security in a sizeable section of the population of the state today. Today, women can confidently travel alone throughout the state without any fear, signifying the success of our government in gaining the trust of a substantial portion of the population," he added.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath highlighted the significant transformation that Uttar Pradesh has undergone since 2017. He said that before 2017, there was a widespread belief that UP faced challenges that adversely impacted both the state and the nation.

"However, over the past six and a half years, our government has successfully changed this perception, both within India and globally. Today, Uttar Pradesh no longer carries the burden of negative stereotypes; instead, it is forging ahead on a positive trajectory," he remarked.

Chief Minister Yogi attributed this remarkable change to the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who, according to him, has given the state a new sense of purpose and direction.

He said that before 2014, the perception of the world about India was negative. "No country in the world took India seriously. This perception underwent a remarkable transformation under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi. Nowadays, the world regards India positively and with a sense of seriousness. India, under Prime Minister Modi's guidance, plays a constructive role in resolving global disputes and crises," Yogi remarked. Yogi further pointed out that today, there is a prevailing sense of confidence across the country, spanning from the north to the south and from the east to the west. This confidence comes from the belief that decisions made by the country's political leadership are in the best interests of both the people and the nation, he added.

Yogi emphasised that under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi, a profound sense of confidence has been instilled among the people of India in terms of external, domestic and economic security. He stated that no rivals can afford to nurture ill intentions toward India, as they are all aware that any intrusion would be met with swift and resolute responses from India's valiant soldiers. The enemies of India now comprehend the tragic consequences of encroaching on India's borders, the chief minister added.

Regarding internal security, Chief Minister Yogi mentioned that there was a time when 120 districts across the country grappled with Naxalism and Maoism. "However, today, these issues are largely confined to Bastar and a few districts in Chhattisgarh," he pointed out. He expressed confidence that with the continuous efforts of the Government of India, these challenges will be completely eradicated in the near future.

Furthermore, Chief Minister Yogi stated that India has undergone remarkable transformation within the past nine years, taking a quantum leap in ease of doing business. "Today, India has jumped from 10th position to become the fifth largest economy globally. Not only this, under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi, India is projected to become the third largest economy in the world by 2027," he said.

He pointed out that UP had doubled its per capita income in just six and a half years. He said previously the sixth largest economy in the country, Uttar Pradesh had now risen to become the third largest economy. "It is poised to become the second-largest economy in the nation in the near future, with an official announcement expected soon," he said.

Student gang-raped in moving car; police deny sexual assault

In a shocking incident, a first year undergraduate student in Bulandshahr was allegedly gang-raped in a moving car and later thrown out of the vehicle in Aurangabad area of the district. She was found in a serious condition and admitted to hospital.

The local police registered a case but denied that the victim was raped. They also took one of the accused into custody.

As per reports, the victim hailing from Jahangirabad Kotwali area of Bulandshahr district is a student of BA first year in a local degree college. According to the victim's mother, the girl had left home for college two days back, when a youth lured her and took her to Bulandshahr on a motorcycle. She said the youth stopped the motorcycle in front of a car occupied by his three friends and they pulled her daughter inside the car and started moving. She alleged that that her daughter shouting for help but all the accused raped her one by one in the moving car and later when she turned unconscious, they threw her out of the car in the Aurangabad Kotwali area and escaped.

The accused also made a video of the act and threatened to make it viral if the girl reported the incident to the police.

The victim was shifted to the hospital, where, on regaining consciousness, she narrated her ordeal to her family members.

Meanwhile, senior officials denied rape charges and claimed that they arrested one of the culprits and were trying to extract details from him so that the remaining culprits could be also brought to book. The victim was also sent for medical examination to confirm of rape.

UP gearing up for Lok Sabha polls

The state machinery in Uttar Pradesh is gearing up for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, with significant changes and preparations underway at the administrative level.

This can be gauged from the fact that the Uttar Pradesh government has taken swift action by reassigning district magistrates and Provincial Civil Service (PCS) officers in line with the Election Commission of India's guidelines to ensure a smooth electoral process.

One of the key directives from the Election Commission is the removal of officers involved in election-related duties who have been stationed in a district for three or more years. This move aims to maintain the efficiency and impartiality of the election process. To comply with this requirement, the state government initiated a large-scale reshuffling of officers even before receiving formal instructions from the Election Commission.

"This proactive approach not only aligns with the Election Commission's guidelines but also offers officers valuable experience in different regions before their crucial roles during elections. It ensures that elections are conducted under the supervision of well-trained and experienced officials, minimising the risk of procedural errors," a senior official told this reporter on Monday.

As a result of this reshuffling, several district magistrates who had been in their positions for an extended period have been transferred to new districts. The notable transfers are of the district magistrates of Bijnoor, Etah and Lalitpur, who were posted in the respective districts since 2021. Of the present lot, 65 district magistrates out of the total 75 districts have performed duties as electoral officers since 2022 or later, with only 10 district magistrates having conducted elections before October 2021.

Elaborate arrangements for Ghosi bypoll today

The Election Commission of India has made elaborate arrangements to conduct free and fair polling in Ghosi which goes to bypoll on Tuesday.

The bypoll was caused by the resignation of Samajwadi Party MLA Dara Singh Chauhan who is now contesting the by-election on Bharatiya Janata Party ticket.

A total of 10 candidates are in the fray in Ghosi. The Election Commission has set up 455 polling booths and 239 polling stations for the polling. The EC said the facility of drinking water, toilets and ramps had been provided at each polling station.

About 4.30 lakh voters are expected to exercise their franchise on Tuesday, which

Alongside the CEO, two additional chief electoral officers (ACEOs) have also been deployed to the State Election Office, strengthening the election machinery's top leadership. The upcoming Lok Sabha elections have drawn significant attention from India's political spectrum, with leaders from various parties, including Congress, Samajwadi Party, Janata Dal (United), Rashtriya Janata Dal, and Trinamool Congress expressing their belief that the Narendra Modi government may call for early elections. Even Bahujan Samaj Party supremo Mayawati, who has declared herself neutral from both Indian National Developmental, Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) and the National Democratic Alliance (NDA), has shared similar apprehensions.

"Amidst these political speculations and preparations, Uttar Pradesh's government machinery is working tirelessly to ensure that the electoral process runs smoothly, with experienced officers at the helm, reinforcing the state's commitment to conducting fair and transparent elections," the official said.
